Job Summary

Flying HIGH, Inc. seeks a qualified STNA instructor. This is a contract position.

The STNA Instructor provides direct instruction to State Tested Nursing Assistant (STNA) students, assuring all regulatory instruction is delivered in accordance with state specific requirements. Will maintain all compliance-related documentation as required. Ensures STNA students are prepared to pass state required testing to become State Tested Nursing Assistants.

An instructor is primarily responsible for the daily management of the classroom including providing relevant content instruction, developing and implementing innovative teaching strategies, supporting the mission of the school in providing quality education, coordinating appropriate clinical experiences to meet the learning needs of students and effectively communicating in a timely manner with school administrators and Program Coordinator regarding professional and student needs. Instructors also serve as ongoing evaluators of the developed curriculum.

Essential Functions:

- Teach assigned STNA classes using effective strategies and principles of adult education.
- Create an environment conducive to learning and student-instructor interaction.
- Monitor student attendance
- Maintain appropriate student and course documentation including: quiz and test grades, skills evaluation grades, and clinical evaluation grades; work closely with academic coordinator to keep accurate student records that meet school and ODH requirements.
- Ensure all State regulations are met in course curriculum.
- Score and evaluate knowledge, skills, and educational performance of participants before verifying completion of the course.
- Assure students satisfactorily demonstrate skills prior to performing with patients or residents.
- Provide direct supervision and observation of all student clinical experience.
- Assist participants with study preparations for the STNA state board exam.

Required Qualifications:

- Must have a current, unencumbered Ohio Registered Nurse (RN or LPN) license – list # and exp. Date + provide verification from OBN website.
- Must have a current Train-the-Trainer certificate.
- Documented 3200 hours (approx. 2 years) of nursing experience as a licensed nurse caring for the elderly or chronically ill individuals of any age. (*Experience may be obtained through employment in a long-term care facility, or a home health agency; RNs may also have obtained experience in a hospital providing care to the chronically ill. --Verification must be provided on company letterhead and include a contact's title, name, and phone number.*)
 - To be a Primary Instructor (**RN**) - document and verify a minimum of two years (3200 hr.) of nursing experience in care of elderly or chronically ill any age in nursing home, hospital Geri unit or other LTC facilities
 - To be a Primary Instructor (**LPN**) - document and verify a minimum of two years (3200 hr.) of nursing experience in care of elderly or chronically ill in a nursing home.

- Strong communication, presentation, and organizational skills.
- Experience in teaching or training in the healthcare field.
- Ability to work effectively with a diverse student population.
- Supervisory experience.
